Trustees Report for the year ended 31 March 2011

The Trustees of the Charity present their annual report and financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2011.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the charity's governing document, applicable law and the requirements in the Statement of Recommended Practice: 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in January 2005, and the Companies Act 2006.

Governing document

The Charity is governed by a Memorandum and Articles of Association incorporated on 1 April 2010.

The Charity is constituted as a charitable company limited by guarantee reg. no: 7210798.

Objects of the Charity and Principal Activities

The objects of the Charity are to advance such purposes as are charitable for the advancement of healthcare for, and for the relief of need of, people often excluded from society, including, but not exclusively, homeless people, alcoholics, drug users and those suffering from mental or physical health problems (excluded people) by, but not exclusively:

- a) the development of targeted healthcare and nursing support for excluded people;
- b) the provision of follow-up support after their discharge from hospital; and
 c) the provision of healthcare-related education and training for excluded people and for staff and volunteers working with excluded people

Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects

The main activities during 2010-11 has been providing support to homeless patients admitted to University College London Hospital during 2010-11, establishing the governance and operational arrangements of the Charity, securing funding for its work to continue, we have started work to expand our model to other hospitals and to develop and introduce the additional strands of our service which include training former homeless people to be Care Navigators who will mentor and advocate for homeless patients during their stay in hospital and following their discharge to define a model for a specialised respite care sanctuary.

Organisation structure

The London Pathway is represented by an honorary group of high profile patrons, managed by a number of Trustees, and administered by officers who deal with the operation of the charitable company. The trustees meet quarterly, the first meeting was held in February 2011 and any new trustees will be appointed with the agreement of the current trustees.

Achievements

In our first year of operation we have:

- run our core service supporting homeless patients in UCLH throughout 2010 11 and have secured funding to continue this work for the next 18 months
- recruited a small team of high calibre staff who model our core values
- won the prestigious 2010 Andy Ludlow Homelessness Award
- started to work to take the London Pathway service to two more hospitals the Royal London and Brighton
- secured significant funding from the Health Foundation under their Closing the Gap programme, and also a significant grant from the London Housing Foundation which is spread over three years
- supported the launch of the Faculty of Homeless Health, in partnership with the new College of Medicine, and have drafted professional standards for health services for homeless people
 - actively sought advice from homeless people about our plans, and our first formerly homeless people have been recruited to work with us as trainee Care Navigators – the first started at the end of March 2011
- in partnership with St Mungo's, developed a detailed service specification and financial model for a London Pathway respite care 'sanctuary' – convalescent or 'home' care for the homeless.
 - developed a web site for the London Pathway, and in February 2011 published the findings from our first full year of work

Review of financial position

The London Pathway was established as a company limited by guarantee on 1 April 2010, and became a registered charity on 1 November 2010. The first funding for it as as a stand alone entity was received on 1 October 2010. Therefore, these accounts are for the period 1 October 2010 to 31 March 2011.

The gross incoming resources for the year amounted to: £72,017, and expenditure of £36,830 which gives a balance of £35,187 to carry forward to 2011-12 of which £12,250 is restricted.

More than three quarters (£27,899) of the expenditure related to the London Pathway's core activities, of this £18,497 were direct costs. The London Pathway is a new charity which has been operational since November 2010, and the inaugural meeting of the trustees was held in February. The Chief Executive and Director of Finance/Company Secretary have spent a considerable proportion of their time setting up governance arrangements and therefore the costs attributed to this activity totalled £8,931.

Reserves policy

It is the policy of the charity to aim to maintain unrestricted reserves, which are the free reserves of the charity at a level which equates to six months of basic overheads. This provides sufficient funds to cover management, administration and support cost and to respond to emergency situations.

Notes to the Financial Statements for year ended 31 March 2011

1. Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements have been consistently applied and follow the recommendation in the Accounting and Reporting by Charities – Statement of Recommended Practice 2005. A summary of the more important accounting policies which have been applied are set out below:

- Basis of accounting: these financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention.
- Incoming resources: Grants made towards the cost of a specific year are included in the statement of financial activities on an accruals basis. Other donations are included as received. Investment income – bank interest receivable is included as received.
- c) Resources expended: these are recognised in the period in which they were incurred. Resources expended include VAT which cannot be recovered, and are allocated to the particular activity where the cost relates directly to that activity.
- Unrestricted funds: these are donations and other incoming resources receivable or generated for the objects of the Charity with out further specified purpose and are available for general funds.
- e) Restricted funds: these are to be used for specific purposes as laid down by the donor.
