Mark Easton is BBC News Home Editor, an award-winning broadcaster and writer who appears regularly on television, radio and online. His first book 'Britain etc.' was published.

Mark's BBC blog was a finalist at the prestigious international Online Journalism Awards and he has also won a number of awards for his television documentaries and news reports, including Royal Statistical Society awards for statistical excellence in 2009 and 2010.
